As this is our last news letter for Term 3 I just wanted to post a few reminders.

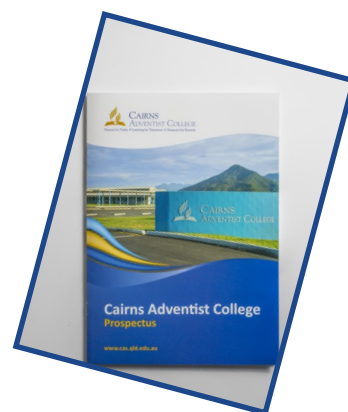
Next Friday is the last day of term 3 and all children are welcome to wear free dress for a gold coin donation.

On Thursday 12th September the Year 3/4 class went on an excursion to the Re-discovery Centre located at the Cairns MRF (Material Recovery Facility). We also had the chance to visit the buy-back shop exploring recycled and second hand items. The Power of Abiding (Eph. 2:8-9; 2 Cor. 11:3)

Has this ever happened to you: You had a great meal the night before and were too tired to wash up. The next day you are greeted by these dirty dishes with dried pieces stuck to the surface. Not cool!

Most people know that a supper plate left out overnight will be hard to clean in the morning. And a good alternative to scrubbing is soaking the dish in hot water and dishwashing liquid.
